Hong Kong Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation and the Hong Kong Society of Rheumatology Scholarship 2020-2021

The Hong Kong Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation (HKARF) and the Hong Kong Society of Rheumatology (HKSR) are inviting applications for a limited number of awards to support overseas specialty training in rheumatology for the year 2020 to 2021. Details of applications are listed below:

- 1. The primary objective of these scholarships is to provide financial support to allied health professionals currently working in the area of rheumatology and who plan to obtain specialty training in overseas countries. Priority will be given to candidates who intend to develop special skills or novel therapeutic modalities in rheumatology in our locality.
- 2. Applying candidates will be short-listed by a Selection Panel appointed by both the HKARF and the HKSR, based on working experience, academic merits and the nature of the overseas programs/attachments. Short-listed candidates may be required to attend an interview.
- 3. The amount of grants available is as follows:
 \$10,000 per person
 Coverage: lump sum subsidy for costs of airfare and accommodation
 A total of 6 scholarships will be awarded per year
- 4. Applicants must be full time allied health professionals (including nurses, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, dieticians who are involved in rheumatology service.
- 5. Applicants must submit endorsement of Department Head for the training concerned, correspondence showing acceptance of the receiving academic unit and details together with the application form.
- 6. Applicants must disclose offers of financial support from other sources, including those that are still under consideration. Candidates who have secured other sources of funding will not be considered for the award.
- 7. Upon approval of the application, reimbursement of the expenditure will be made during / upon completion of the training, with a ceiling amount as depicted in clause number 3.

- 8. Successful candidates are required to submit a report each to the Hong Kong Society of Rheumatology / Hong Kong Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation regarding their training activities within 2 months of their return to Hong Kong. The final installment of the grant will be paid only after receipt of this report.
- 9. Every application must comprise two copies of the following:
 - a. The completed application form
 - b. A proposal of the training program in no more than 1,500 words
 - c. Recommendation letters from the immediate supervisor and the head of Department (if applicable)
 - d. Letters from referees (if available)
 - e. A brief curriculum vitae
 - f. Copies of relevant qualifications attained
